to Tasman Isle, variable winds 5 to 15 knots tending west to north westerly 10 to 20 knots by sunrise Monday. Then local afternoon sea breezes to 15 knots developing with shore. Seas one to 2 metres south to south east swell to 3 metres slowly decreasing. Weather dry with visibility good. Tasmanian Island to Hobart, west to north west winds, 10 to 20 knots with local inshore afternoon sea breezes, inshore the Derwent Estuary Monday afternoon. Winds well south of Tasman Isle this evening, locally reaching north west at 20 to 25 knots. 1 to 2 metre seas in open waters, 2 to 2.5 metres south to south east swell. fine except for local drizzle patches in the early hours of Monday morning otherwise good visibility. Outlook for the further 48 hours, continuation of the moderate to fresh westerly airflow over Tasmania. Weak fronts are likely to pass near the south coast of Tasmania, sea breezes inshore on Tasmania's east and south east coast. And that ends the weather.
